# JAPAN DOMINATES IN INDIA

#### Japan teammates Kokoro Fujii and Miho Nonaka placed first at the fourth Bouldering World Cup of the **2016** season.

Hundreds of excited spectators crowded a warm and humid venue on Sunday for another thrilling IFSC event finale.

## **Competition Highlights**

The finals round of the first World Cup in Navi Mumbai was full of drama, with ultimate determination of podium placements coming down to the wire. In the end, Japan claimed four medals, and Fujii and Nonaka won the first Bouldering World Cup of their careers.

After winning the previous four bouldering competitions, Shauna Coxsey of Great Britain missed the finals cut and finished ninth overall. Chongqing runner-up Jan Hojer of Germany also did not climb past the semi-finals and finished eighteenth overall.

### **Finals Recap**

The first men's problem (M1) featured exhausting upsidedown jamming between well-set twin volumes, and only runner-up Tomoa Narasaki of Japan conserved enough energy to reach the Top. Most of the men rebounded on the running start and concluding dyno of M2, including Fujii who flashed the two-move problem. When Narasaki failed to link the powerful moves connecting volumes and crimps on M3, four athletes began the final riddle with two sends apiece. Although all four competitors sent M4, Fujii did so in just two attempts for Gold. Alexey Rubtsov of Russia and Jongwon Chon of Korea settled for third and

fourth place, respectively, after requiring more attempts to stick the beginning of M2.

The first women's problem (W1) was fairly straightforward, and four women flashed the problem. W2 and W3 were different stories. Bronze medallist Akiyo Noguchi of Japan snagged the penultimate hold of W2 semi-statically with a unique leg extension requiring much flexibility, but she fell lunging for the Top. Monika Retschy of Germany strung together a series of burly moves after a difficult two-hand start to W3 before falling at the final slopers. Since W2 and W3 saw no sends, Retschy catapulted herself to a provisional first place by flashing W4. She settled for second when Nonaka also stuck the tenuous last move, becoming the only female athlete to send two finals problems.

#### **Next: Innsbruck Bouldering Rematch**
