

IFSC CLIMBING WORLD CUP PERM 2013 : VICTORIES FOR FAVORITES AND LAST MINUTE WINS IN RUSSIA

Suspense until the very last second was the mark of the IFSC Lead and Speed World Cup in Perm last weekend. In the end, local heroes Alina Gaidamakina and Arseniy Shevchenko were the the fastest athletes in Russia, and gold in the Lead competitions went to Jain Kim and Ramón Julian Puigblanque!

As expected, Russian Speed power dominated once more on the home turf in Perm: Five (women) and four (men) athletes represented the White-Blue-Red in the top eight demonstrating the current strength of last weekend's host nation. And so double Russian Gold was actually no surprise at the Sport Center of Sucharev. This time 23-year-old Arseniy Shevchenko stepped into the breach for his compatriot and World Cup leader Stanislav Kokorin, ending up in the finals against reigning European champion Libor Hroza. But Hroza fell and Shevchenko celebrated his first world cup victory ever with a final time of 7.65 seconds. In the women's competition, the Russian ladies conquered the whole podium: Gold for World Cup leader Alina Gaidamakina (8.35 seconds in the finals), Silver for Yuliya Levochkina, Bronze for Mariia Krasavina.

High suspense until the very last second

But time was not only a decisive factor in the Speed competition in Perm, it also played a big role in the Lead competition, as well. In the IFSC Lead World Cup, five women (Fakhritdinova, Kim, Markovic, Oda and Röck) were leading in a tie after the Semi-finals. Jain Kim was the only athlete to top out in the final round taking home the Gold medal, followed by Magdalena Röck, Momoka Oda and Mina Markovic ex aequo with a height of 32+. So in the end the attempted time in the finals decided the rest of the podium and meant Magdalena Röck got her first Silver medal in an IFSC World Cup competition, Bronze went to Japan's Momoka Oda.

The men's competition was marked by a flood of tops until the finals, with nine athletes placed in a tie going into the Finals! In the deciding round, reigning European champion Ramón Julian Puigblanque showed the toughest performance with a height of 45. Close behind him was Puurs winner Jakob Schubert (43+) who won Silver, and Bronze went to Korea's Hyunbin Min (37+).
